CIRCULAR NO S3 OF 2025: ALERT ON THE HAND, FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE (HFMD) OUTBREAK

The National Institute for Communicable Diseases (NICD) has issued an alert on the outbreak on the Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (HFMD). According to this alert, HFMD cases have been since the beginning of February 2025 in eThekwini District. These cases have been found in primary schools and daycare centres in the district's northern region.

Furthermore, the Department of Health has also issued a media alert that is dated 18 February 2025 calling for calm amid this outbreak, as well as vigilance and implementation of safety measures that will curb its spread.

HFMD is a communicable viral infection that is transmitted by close physical contact and the cases present with symptoms such as fever, sore throat, fatigue, loss of appetite, small blisters on the inside of the mouth, sides of the tongue, palms of the hands, and soles of the feet

It is a mild viral infection which often clears without medication, however, schools must play a critical role in preventing its spread, as children interact and may infect each other.

The Principal should also contact local public health authorities for advice following suspected or confirmed cases of HFDM. Preventative measures that schools should take are stated in the attached circular: Circular No 3 of 2025.
