#### 1. SPECIFICATION

Qualified and interested Service Providers are hereby invited to submit quotations for Braille Training on maths and technical notation for educators at Three Special Schools for learners with visual impairment. This training will be face-to-face in small learning groups and is aimed at mathematics, science and computer educators, teacher aides and braillists as part of continuous professional development.

Ref No: RFQ2023/07/016

The Directorate of Inclusive Education has identified a need for face-to-face to training on Braille for Mathematics educators, teacher aides and Braillists based at the three Special Schools for learners with visual impairment in the province. The Eastern Cape Department of Education therefore seeks to contract a Service Provider who will conduct this training in a workshop format, over 5-days in Mthatha from 06 – 10 November 2023.

The service provider must be able to conduct a comprehensive 5-day face-to-face training workshop for 30 participants over 5 days focusing on several the methodology and mathematics/technical notation used in Mathematics, Maths Literacy, Science and Computers in the CAPS curriculum.

# 2. Planned Outcomes /Objectives of the Training.

Training should be aligned to the specifications below:

 Increased knowledge and comprehensive understanding of the format of United English Braille and specific terminology for Mathematics, Science and Computers (Grades 7 to 12) in the education of visually impaired learners.



- Specific instruction and practical opportunity to learn and apply Technical and Maths
  Braille in various formats, on a variety of devices including traditional Braille
  machines, hybrid devices and refreshable Braille Devices, including both the reading
  (decoding) and writing (production) components, with reasonable speed and
  accuracy.
- 3. Specific instruction in terminology and Braille production of Mathematical concepts for Senior Phase and FET Phase according to CAPS curriculum. Mathematics concepts and skills as required include methods of calculation, number concept of integers, algebraic modelling, data handling, probability, spatial concepts and skills and measurement. Range and mix of problem types must be relevant to all Grades or have examples for Grades 7 to Grade 12.
- 4. Understanding and application of the relevant South African legislative and policy frameworks, including the rights of every learner to quality education and provision of appropriate levels of support (SIAS Policy, 2014) (specialist services, LTSM and assistive devices, curriculum adaptation and classroom accommodations and environmental adaptation, within the Inclusive Education framework).

## 2 Terms of Reference

- 1. The service provider must be able to conduct a 5-day face-to-face workshop for 30 participants at one venue in Mthatha.
- 2. Training must be provided in a face-to-face format to 30 Maths and CAT educators (educators across Senior and FET Phases) in a 5-day period, consisting of no less than 30 training hours, consisting of both theoretical sessions, practical application in the classroom with learners and groupwork with opportunity to demonstrate/present learning by the end of the training. The prime focus will be on the teaching of UEB Technical notation for Mathematical, Science and Computer, as an essential adapted format of teaching and learning for learners with visual impairment in these subjects.
- 3. Training pack (printed handouts/training materials in a bound booklet) must be available for each participant.
- 4. The service provider should be able to provide access to Perkins Braille machines electronic Braille devices to use in practical sessions, as well as Braille paper, and the means to emboss work.

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- 5. Each participant will also receive a Classroom Resource pack and opportunity to learn to develop/make low-cost learning and teaching materials through demonstration (basic materials and stationery supplied by Service Provider).
- 6. The service provider should be accredited and have current registration with a training authority such as SAQA or ETDP Seta, or Braille Authority of South Africa for this training and must be able to provide evidence of such.
- 7. The service provider should be able to provide the Department with the training credentials of all presenters/trainers.
- 8. Service provider will compile a comprehensive report and improvement plan for each school. Report to be supplied to each Principal and Provincial Office by end of training for monitoring purposes, and for planning of further training.
- The service provider must be able to provide accredited professional points for accreditation with the South African Council of Educators within 30 days of the training.
- 10. The service provider must be able to issue certificates of attendance to participants after the training.
- 11. The service provider must be able to include within their presentations the following:
  - ✓ Principles of best methodology in special needs education (visual impairment)
  - ✓ Use examples from the CAPS Curriculum.
  - ✓ Promotion of specialist therapeutic and educational support strategies, including a focus on ECD.

#### 2. Submission of Quotations

- 2.2. NB no faxed nor emailed quotation will be accepted.
- 3. <u>Declaration certificate for Local Production and Content for Designated Sectors (this paragraph is applicable only to designated sectors i.e furniture products, steel, plastic pipes etc.</u>
- 3.1. Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011 (Regulation 9) makes provision for the production and content.

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- 3.2. Only locally produced goods, services or works or locally manufactured goods, with a stipulated minimum threshold for local production and content will be considered,
- 3.3. Where necessary, two stage process may be followed, where the first stage involves a minimum threshold for local production and content and the second stage price and B-BBEE.,
- 3.4. A person awarded in relation to a designated sector, may not sub-contract in such a manner that the local production and content of the overall value of the contract is reduced to below the stipulated minimum threshold,
- 3.5. The local content (LC) expressed as a percentage of the price must be calculated in accordance with the SABS approved technical specification number SATS 1286: 2011 as follows:

LC = [1 - x / y] \* 100 Where x is the imported content in Rand y is the price in Rand excluding value added tax (VAT)

3.6. Prices referred to in the determination of x must be converted to Rand (ZAR) by using the exchange rate published by South African Reserve Bank (SARB) at 12:00 on the date of advertisement or of the as indicated in paragraph 4.1 below.

# 3.7. A quotation shall be disqualified if -

- (a) The Declaration Certificate and the Annex C (Local Content Declaration: Summary Schedule) are not submitted as part of the quotation documentation; and
- (b) the bidder fails to declare that the Local Content Declaration Templates (Annex C, D and E) have been audited and certified as correct.

Bidders are required to achieve a stipulated minimum threshold for Local Production and Content as per DTI designated sector as per section 9 of the PPPFA Regulations of 2011.

## 4. Elimination Criteria

#### Stage 1

The purpose of this section is to determine which responses are compliant with the requirements issued herein.

- 4.1. The SBD 4, not completed comprehensively, correctly and signed.
- 4.2. The Declaration Certificate for Local Production and Content (SBD 6.2) together with the Annexure C (Local Content Declaration: Summary Schedule) must be completed, duly signed and submitted together with the bid documents. The manufacturer must indicate who his/ her Suppliers of materials will be for the duration of the contract and provide proof thereof. In this instance, the certificate of local content relating to the materials supplied must be completed by the relevant supplier and included together with the bidding documents.
- 5. <u>Stage 2 elimination in terms of stipulated minimum threshold for Local Production and</u>
  Content for School Furniture and Office Furniture

Bid will be eliminated for non-completion and non -submission of the following:

- 5.1. Non-completion of SBD 6.2.
- 5.2. Non-completion and submission of annexure C (local content).
- 5.3. Non-submission of the DTI exemption letter where applicable.

# **Claiming of Preference Points**

- Preference points allocated Historically Disadvantaged individuals may be claimed by Persons who had no franchise in national elections prior to 1983 and 1993.
- Preference points for Locality may be allocated Preference points allocated for women may be claimed if there is sufficient evidence that such woman has ownership of 51% or more of the enterprise shareholding.
- Preference points allocated for persons with disabilities may only be claimed there is sufficient evidence that such person has ownership of 51% or more ofthe enterprise shareholding.
- Preference points allocated for promotion of youth may only be claimed if thereis sufficient evidence that such youth has ownership of 51% or more of the enterprise shareholding.
- For promotion of enterprises located within the Eastern Cape Province may be claimed by submission of proof that the enterprise is located within the borders of Eastern Cape Province. This includes an enterprise whose head office may be situated in another province but has a fully-fledged branch within Eastern Cape Province. Enterprises located outside the borders of the Eastern Cape Province and who only appoints agents andor commission warehouses in this municipal area are expressly excluded from claiming points for this goal.
