QUALIFIED AND INTERESTED SERVICE PROVIDERS ARE HEREBY INVITED TO SUBMIT QUOTATIONS FOR TRAINING OF 100 EDUCATORS ON SASL AS A LANGUAGE OF TEACHING AND LEARNING AS PART OF CONTINUOUS PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT.

The Directorate of Inclusive Education has identified a need for both face-to-face and online training over a period of six months on South African Sign Language as a Language of Teaching and Learning for 100 educators from Schools for the Deaf across the Eastern Cape Province. The Eastern Cape Department of Education, therefore seeks to contract a Service Provider to conduct this training in a workshop format over 5 days, with the online component extending over six months.

2. PLANNED OUTCOMES /OBJECTIVES OF THE TRAINING.

Training should be aligned with the specifications below:

- 1. **Online Training:** The provider must offer online interactive learning.
- 2. **Physical Training:** The provider must also incorporate in-person contact sessions as part of the SOIL programme.
- 3. The training must include a six-month-long online module.
- 4. The training should Enable Educators to begin teaching using SASL to Deaf learners
- 5. The training course must consist of 4 modules and 34 lessons.
- 6. The service provider must provide Educators with a greater understanding of the morphology, semantics, and syntax of SASL







2 TERMS OF REFERENCE

- 1. The service provider must be able to conduct a 5-day face-to-face workshop in the four schools for the deaf.
- 2. **SACE Accredited:** The provider must be SACE-accredited.
- The service provider must have at least 7 years of experience in providing SASL training as a language of learning and teaching, NOT basic training on sign language.
- 4. The service provider should be able to provide the Department with the training credentials of all presenters/trainers.
- 5. The service provider will compile a comprehensive report and improvement plan for each attendee. Report to be supplied to Provincial Office by the end of training for monitoring purposes, and planning of further training.
- 6. The service provider must be able to *issue certificates of competence and/or attendance* to participants after the training, depending on competency tests.
