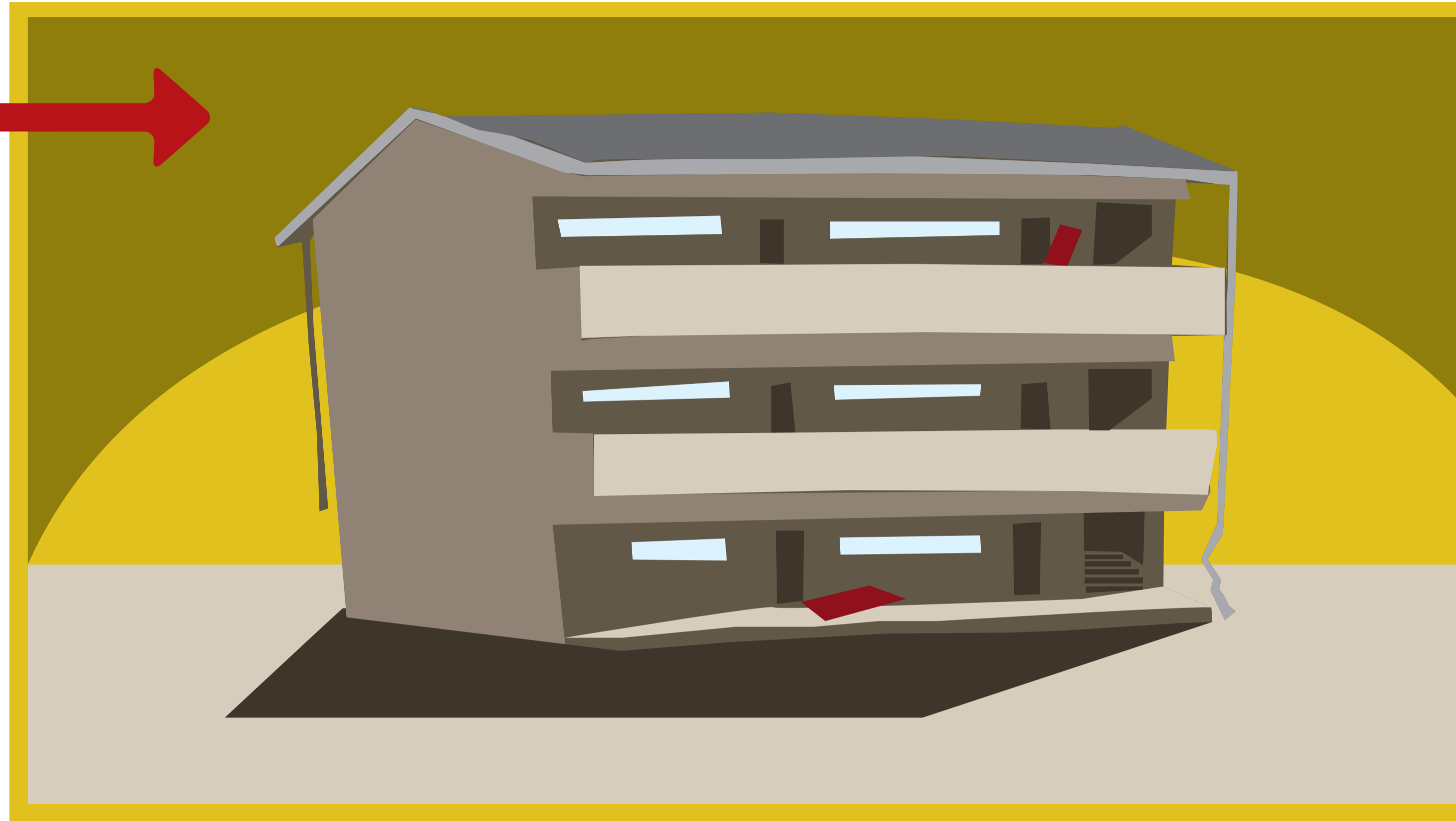

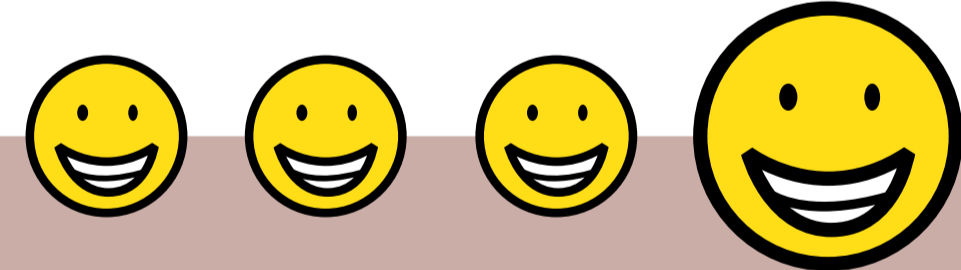
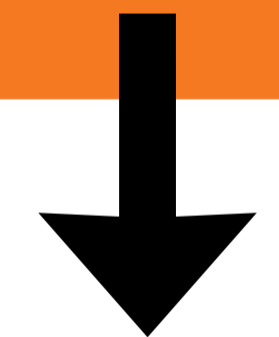
Insecure school:

Begin to manage and control access to school grounds; Speak out against crime and violence; Motivate learners and educators; Deal with theft, vandalism, bullying, gangs, gender violence; Engage local district officials.



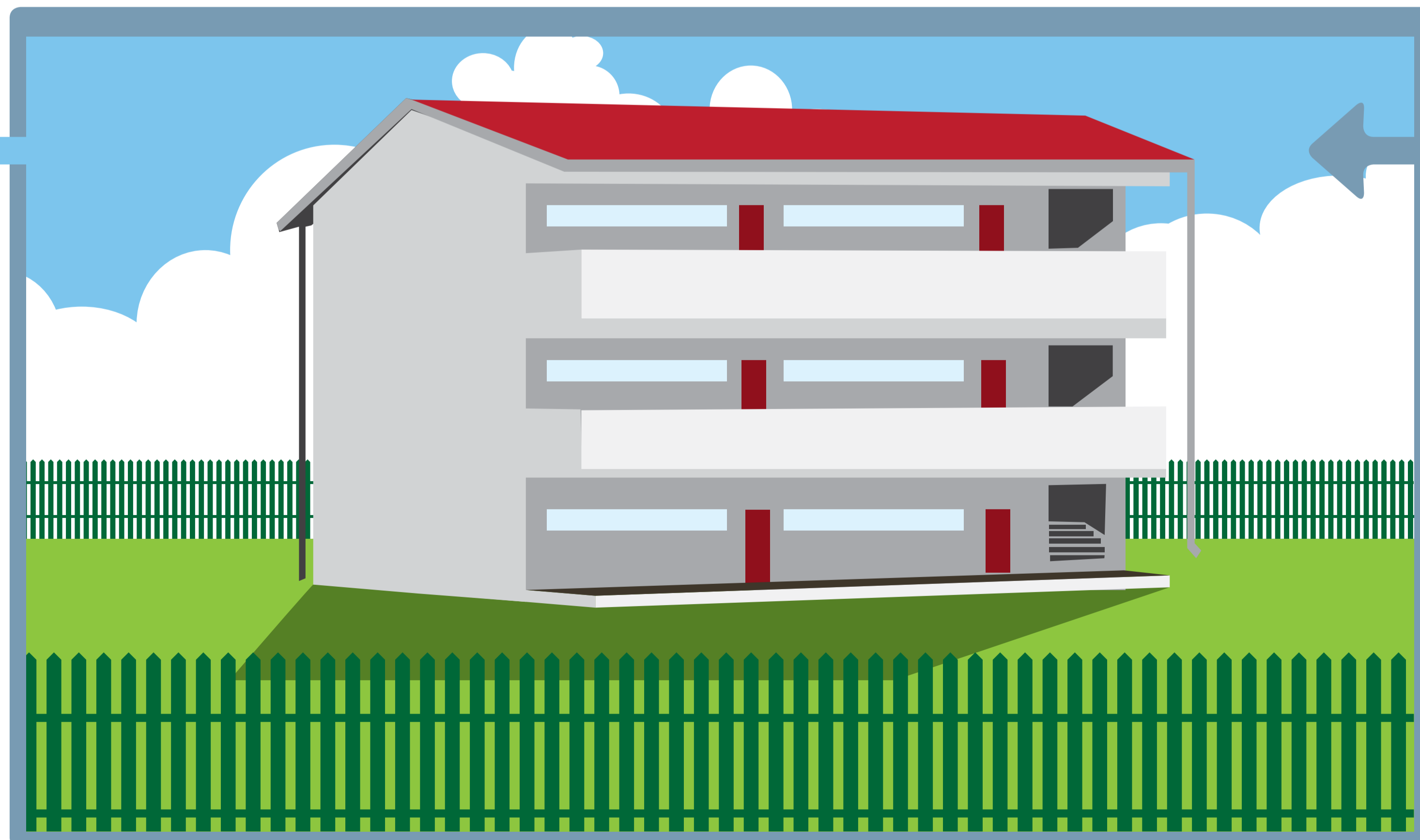
School with emerging security:

Install security fence and monitor the school perimeter; Stamp out possession of dangerous weapons and drugs on premises; Reporting incidents of child neglect, abuse and rape; Develop a code of conduct;



Caring school:

School grounds and access controlled and managed; Strong democratic management and governance systems in place; Community and school working together on safety issues; Discipline across school evident; Highly motivated learners and educators; Culture of learning and teaching achieved;



Secure school:

Improved community participation and support; Petty theft and bullying being rooted out; Routes to and from school made safer; Incidents of crime and violence reported and addressed; Educators and learners engaged in sharing of responsibilities; Active school management; Improved academic achievements;
